## Famous Places Around the World Project

## Please place a title on each page you choose to include in your project.

- 1. Good projects have a Title Page and a Cover Page.
- 2. There is plenty of room, as you know, in your book to add and design your own pages. Don't be afraid to add or delete pages. You are so very smart and talented! I am sure your ideas will make your book extra special.
- 3. A good page to include in your project is an Illustration page or page with a drawing of the famous place you have chosen to research. A paragraph describing the famous place would be a spectacular addition.
- 4. Another page that could be included is a Drawn or Printed Map Page of the continent on which your famous place is found. You could indicate with a star where your landmark or famous place is located on the continent. You could also include a caption that names the city within the continent where your landmark is located.
- 5. You might also want to include a Close-Up Page that zooms in on the continent to show the city in which the landmark is located. You can either draw or print a picture of the area (it might be a city, a town, or open land). You might want to label the things you included on this page to let others know what they are looking at. You could include a paragraph about this area if you wanted the page to be amazing!
- 6. You might also want to include a Perspective Page or a page that shows your chosen landmark from different angles or perspectives (you could

print or draw them). It is always a good idea to neatly label the components of your landmark that you have chosen to highlight. You can include a small caption under each illustration or picture to make the page extra special.

- 7. No research project would be complete without an <a href="Interesting Facts">Interesting Facts</a>
  <a href="page">page</a>: You can list five to ten interesting facts about your landmark/famous place. A good way to accomplish this task is to write complete sentences and try to vary your sentences so that they do not all begin in the same way.
- 8. Every good research project needs a <u>Table of Contents page</u>: It is best to number each page that you have chosen to include in your project so that you can create a table of contents for your book.

When you have completed what you have chosen to add to your project, there are many ways to build your Researcher's Notebook:

- o You could staple the pages together.
- You could glue the pages in a spiral notebook that you already have.
- You could glue the pages in an old magazine.
- You could Find an old book that is no longer being read (ask permission) and glue your pages there.
- You could also come up with a unique idea for presenting your research on your own.
